Built between 1929 and 1932, the main auditorium organ is the largest musical instrument on earth. More powerful than a dozen orchestras, it can both whisper and thunder into the 5.5 million cubic feet of air space in the main arena, even in its current 25% state of functionality. Free 1/2 hour concerts Mon.-Fri. at 12:00 noon, May-Oct. are followed by a free 1/2 hour tour of the instrument and restoration project. An indepth (2 hour) "Behind the Scenes" tour is provided every Wed. at 10AM throughout the year and concludes with the noon concert. It features sections of the organ and building normally closed to the public and gives a highly technical look at the 10 year, \$16 million restoration effort led by the Historic Organ Restoration Committee to return both organs in Boardwalk Hall to fully functional--a state not realized since the great hurricane of 1944. No reservations are necessary for either tour or concerts.
