Freeholder Formica distributed the Atlantic City Property Guide that was sent to Atlantic City residents. Freeholder Formica reported that the column indicating the County tax increased 118% is incorrect.

**WRITTEN
COMMUNICATIONS
AND PETITIONS**

Freeholder Fitzpatrick stated that she received the resolution sponsored by the Greater Egg Harbor Regional High School District regarding the expansion of the Atlantic Institute of Technology (ACIT) and a response from Dr. Guenther, Superintendent (ACIT). She asked why we are expanding ACIT when other schools are suffering? We should brainstorm on some new ideas, like a County-wide School District. ACIT is doing a great job and the school is diversified.

Freeholder Coursey asked how do we get the high schools to implement some of the programs that ACIT offers? Perhaps that would keep kids in the neighborhood schools. Freeholder Coursey stated he did not agree with Freeholder Fitzpatrick's proposal to close Pleasantville High School and send half the students to Absegami High School and the other half to Mainland Regional High School. Chairwoman Gatto granted Freeholder Coursey permission to direct several questions to Dr. Phil Guenther, Superintendent of the ACIT during "Written Communications and Petitions." He suggested that the Education and Schools Committee host a meeting with the school superintendents.

Chairwoman Gatto stated that each superintendent is fighting for their own district. The problem is that the State has failed at properly funding school districts. It's the State that is putting us in this predicament.

County Executive Levinson stated that wherever a student attends school the money follows. Teachers are paid the same rate no matter the number of students in the class. Therein lies the dilemma. It's a problem when property taxes fund schools. Mr. Bumpus, the County Superintendent, has to defend the State formula.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Chairwoman Gatto opened the meeting to the public at 5:10 p.m.

John Keenan, resident of Galloway and Superintendent of Greater Egg Harbor Regional High School District, thanked the Board for their suggestions to resolve the issue. The Greater Egg Harbor Regional High School District resolution requests that the ACIT slow down and discuss the impact of the expansion.

Peggy Capone, resident of Hamilton Township with property on Main Street, asked how long Cotton Mill Bridge will be closed during the time it is replaced. Ms. Capone also asked if the businesses have been informed of the closure.

Dr. Phil Guenther, Superintendent of ACIT, reported that ACIT is not a chartered school but a public school. Dr. Guenther provided an overview of the School and the opportunities the school provides. The expansion will not be able to serve all the students that would like to attend.

Peggy Capone, resident of Hamilton Township, asked that the admission process be reviewed along with other aspects.

John Keenan, Superintendent of Greater Egg Harbor Regional High School District provided an overview of the schools within his district and questioned the application process. He suggested why not use a lottery to select students to attend ACIT.

Mike Price, resident of Egg Harbor Township, stated he agreed that a Committee should be formed to address the issue discussed. Mr. Price informed the Freeholders that elected officials can no longer use issued badges as a result of recent legislation. Mr. Price extended congratulations to Clerk to the Board Sonya Harris.

There being no further comments, Chairwoman Gatto closed the public portion at 5:33 p.m.
