## Exposure to lead can seriously harm your child's health!



Damage to the brain and nervous system



Slowed growth and development



Learning and behavior problems



Hearing and speech problems

## Lead is a metal that can be found throughout the environment. Children can be exposed through:

- homes built before 1978 with chipped or peeling paint
- imported toys, candies, pottery and/or makeup
- certain parental occupations or hobbies
- soil, dust, water, air and certain foods or spices

## All children should have a blood lead test:

- at age 1 and 2
- from age 3 up to age 6 if never tested before
- anytime through age 6 if they've been exposed to a known or suspected source of lead



Talk to your child's pediatrician about getting a lead screening today!
