Autism Awareness / Acceptance Month

Children with autism are often seen as dependent and helpless. These children may need more accommodations and assistance, but that doesn't mean they can't learn the skills and knowledge necessary to be independent.

Here are some tips to help you assist your child with self-advocacy:

- 1. Help your child understand how and when to disclose their diagnosis.
- 2. Provide children with different choices daily to help them understand they have freedom of choice.
- 3. Make sure your child knows the difference between their needs and preferences.
- 4. Help your child write letters to others explaining what they want and need. Include your child in IEP meetings.

Mental Health Awareness Month

The pandemic has made it more acceptable to talk about mental health. It has also reduced the stigma (a set of negative and often unfair beliefs) surrounding mental health, which has made people more comfortable getting support. It's becoming more commonplace to get mental health support to maintain wellness and to prevent the progression of conditions, potentially averting a mental health crisis. Even if your mental health isn't poor, you can benefit from regular self-directed check-ins. Virtual therapy has become more popular. Today, it's easier to connect with a therapist through a computer or smartphone.

How to Find Help

Outpatient counseling and therapy is community-based. It doesn't take place in a hospital. Many providers offer tele-health appointments that can be done with your computer or phone. Turn over your insurance card and contact the company for assistance, look at the insurance company's online provider directory, or ask your doctor or friends who they might recommend and then check to see if they accept your insurance.
