

Atlantic County has some great places to look for activities for children and families.

To find exhibits, performances and activities, search Atlantic County's extensive network of libraries. Each posts a calendar of events and you will find opportunities focusing on Black History Month as well as seasonal fun and informative activities.

Libraries also have weekend and evening hours so find the one closest, or with an interesting activity, and take the opportunity to step away from the television and out of the house! For branch locations and hours, visit: www.atlanticlibrary.org. Many cities and municipalities have libraries as well so look for them too.

Atlantic County also has five Family Success Centers developed and designed to be family and youth friendly. Two are located in Atlantic City. The other three are in Egg Harbor Township, Galloway and Hammonton. All can be accessed using public transportation. Some may highlight Black History Month through events and others may incorporate the theme into their programs.

Our Goals:

- The CIACC shall understand the strengths and needs of the community, including, but not limited to, service needs of youth and families.
- The CIACC shall assess children, youth and young adult systems needs for the purposes of making recommendations regarding service and resource development priorities and improvements.
- The participants in the CIACC shall reflect a partnership among county governments, families/caregivers, consumers, children, youth and young adults, community-based organizations, informal supports, and agencies providing services.
